

REGULAR SESSION ** ECONOMY BOROUGH COUNCIL ** JANUARY 26, 2010

Council President Ronald R. Rock called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers of the Economy Municipal Building to conduct business of general purposes.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL

William Vescio, President, Bryon Funding, Inc., gave an update and a market commentary of the Police Pension Fund and the Non Uniformed Pension Fund for the Fourth Quarter, 2009 and the year 2009.

PUBLIC HEARING: Amending Zoning Ordinance – Slappo Request

Mr. Rock turned the meeting over to Mr. Fouse for the purpose of conducting a Public Hearing for the proposed Zoning Amendment Application of Frances A. Ciamacco, Executrix of the Estate of Mary Slappo a/l/a/ Mary Slapo, that would amend the Zoning Ordinance to change Parcels 60-085-0222-000-01-1, 60-185-0222-001-01-1, and 60-185-0222-002-01-1 from R-2 Suburban Residential, to RA, Agricultural Rural Residential. Request transcript of hearing for details.

MOTION by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mr. Thomas – to close the proceedings and authorize the solicitor to prepare the Findings of Facts and Conclusions of Law for the next meeting. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

HEAR THE PUBLIC:

Mr. Rock opened the meeting to the public restricted to borough business; give your name and address for the borough secretary; each person would have one chance to speak for 3-5 minutes.

Butch Thompson, First Street, asked Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski concerning the last meeting; there was a discussion about the Economy Borough Volunteer Fire Department being behind on some type of a financial report and the comment was made that she would consider withholding funds from the fire department and asked if she thinks the comment was necessary. Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski reported the comment was that it is the law that the fire department is to provide a report, it is the law that if they do not provide the report the borough is not to continuing funding until they get that report. Mr. Thompson asked if she withholds the funds and her house catches on fire, who she is going to call. Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski reported that she just stated what Economy Borough is required to do. Mr. Thompson reported he felt the comment was unnecessary. Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski thanked Mr. Thompson for his opinion.

R. J. Burns, 112 Almond Way, reported he threw his name in for the Municipal Authority Board and asked if we have an employee of the borough that works for the Economy Borough Sewer Department that is on the Municipal Board. Mr. Kunkle reported he used to. Mr. Rock reported he is retired. Mr. Burns asked if the borough has a code of ethics to hold employees and Council member accountable; provided a sample copy from Ebbensburg Borough website; thinks it a good idea to hold people accountable; would cut out he said, she said like with the scrap money and stuff like that. Mr. Rock reported it would best go to Mr. Bucuren. Mr. Bucuren reported he was going to ask for a copy. Mr. Rock asked the secretary to make copies for all the elected officials and Mr. Fouse.

Jo Ann Borato, 2001 Conway Wallrose Road, reported she appreciates Butch Thompson's passion; in her opinion he came over a little snarky; by the same token if we are in some instances asking for everybody to be accountable for spending; can go back to a litany of things asking people to be accountable, then she understands wanting accountability everywhere there is a dollar passed between here and there; appreciates the passion, maybe it didn't have to be phrased that way, maybe the verbiage wasn't right; still believes in accounting for the dollars given. Mrs. Borato reported as passionate as she was about the officers getting the extra 15 military day pay for active duty deployment; is passionate to see Economy Borough enact something in the code (went through the eCode on line at economyborough.org) searched and could only find a reference in the code as to their pension if they are on military leave; the state law has a gray area where it can be read a number of different ways; would like some sort of verbiage for Economy Borough in the code book that they only get the 15 days; make it clear once and for all, not hearsay; have it written down somewhere that this is the law if you are an employee of Economy Borough. Mayor Poling asked Mr. Fouse if Council makes a decision on something, doesn't that make it legislative law; thought it was passed for 15 days years ago; is that what they go by as a guideline or is a code/ordinance actually adopted. Mr. Fouse reported the whole issue is not what our law says, it's what the state law says. Mayor Poling reported he thinks the confusion is what the state law actually is. Mr. Fouse reported that is where the confusion is. Mrs. Borato reported it is horrible. Mr. Rock verified that is why she would like Council to have something in black and white. Mr. Fouse reported it makes great sense, but do they understand his point. Mrs. Borato reported at her company, if you sign up and you are a member of the National Guard, etc., if you get deployed, in the SOP for her company, you only get the 15 days; it is made clear; if you are an employee of this borough and are deployed that should be made part of the SOP of Economy Borough that you only get the 15 days. Mr. Fouse verified that Mrs. Borato works for a private entity; she does not have to worry about what the state legislature is going to write, Council does, because the State Legislature created us; when they tell us what the law is we have to comply with it or at least try to be consistent with it. Mrs. Borato reported she would have to contact the state legislators. Mrs. Borato reported there was an article in the Beaver County Times about development in Economy Borough and an article in the Pittsburgh Business Times about development in the Galleria at Pittsburgh Mills; concerned that only one of the stories was released by the developer; concerned the information released about any development in Economy Borough may put Economy Borough in a bad position when it comes to awarding payment on the property of the eminent domain since there was no information from a developer. Mr. Fouse reported he does not know how this will play out in terms of damages; a taking is a taking; feels the value of it was the same two years ago as it was today; there could be argument now that there is immediate access to a large tract of land that might put a more positive value on that shopping center; that was the case two years ago when the declaration of taking was filed; the case becomes speculation of the value before and after the taking; believes there are a good number of hurdles that still need to be overcome before there is a developer for that large tract of land; there is a series of issues out there. Mrs. Borato reported she is not against development, just with the way it was presented.

Matt Morrone, 208 Foxglove Drive, reported on business properties in Center Township; when the anchor store came, other stores came.

Mr. Fouse reported as long as the litigation has been in Economy Borough, the litigation in Center Township was twice as long; when one of the big anchors came in, the other ones followed; it just happens that way; have

to rely on your planning commission to help you through that; they look at these things and hopefully can control growth, if it happens; Economy Borough has the same planning consultant that Center Township has.

Meagan Trimbur, 3225 Ridge Road Ext., asked if the fire department or police department are trained in dealing with individuals with impaired communication skills. Mayor Poling reported a police officer is trained in sign language. Mr. Thomas reported someone that works at the 9-1-1 center, is a paramedic and EMT with Economy Ambulance started a program about two years ago with money from the state and money from a grant about putting certain ID on children; he has researched a lot of that. Mrs. Trimbur reported she works with kids with special needs; provided a website from Woodside Fire Protection District in California; on the website is a video that shows how First Responders should respond to someone who is non verbal; provided the information to Mrs. Mutschler.

Mrs. Trimbur reported she understands that the code enforcer has harassment charges going against him; knows it is a new year and wonders if Council has thought about what they are going to do in regards to him; continues to be issues and issues; thinks that is a big issue; criminal charges are pretty serious; understands there is a hearing coming up and if Council is going to do anything or continue to say good job; is there any reprimand going on. Mr. Rock reported there is a hearing scheduled for February 10th; Mr. Fouse will be representing Economy Borough at the hearing. Mrs. Trimbur reported as a taxpayer she has an issue with Mr. Fouse representing the borough; feels he has put himself in his own situation; feels he should be representing himself. Mr. Rock reported we will see what happened at the hearing on February 10th.

R. J. Burns asked who the employee is that found the Nuclear Troxler used for the kind of work he does, site development work. Mr. Rock reported a Road Department employee. Mr. Burns said the news reported a \$1,000 reward offered and asked if the reward was given to that employee; feels he should not take the reward because he was on borough time (sure the police run into that all the time and knows they don't take them); feels if the reward is offered it should go to Economy Borough or given to some type of charity. Mrs. Mutschler reported the police department turned everything over to the Pennsylvania State Police; they are handling it at this point; feels there is a lot more in depth to the investigation because they have to see that the people didn't say it was missing for so many days and want to know where they were at when they thought it was missing; not cut and dry. Mr. Burns reported since the employee was on borough time there should be no reward; does not feel he should have financial gain over that. Mr. Googins reported he heard a statement that there was a reward, but has not heard any more about it; maybe the solicitor should look into that if it occurs; the DEP is also involved. Mr. Rock said we will find out and see what happens.

MINUTES:

January 12, 2010 Minutes – tabled until the next meeting.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Poling reported the resident at 222 Woodcroft is requesting guiderail; gas meter has been hit four times. Mr. Googins reported he will look at this request.

Mayor Poling reported he received a call from Rick Creese; they are not requesting to be paid for their vacation; because they were on active duty in 2009 they lost vacation time; they are requesting to be entitled to that vacation; not to cash it in, but to be able to use it; Sam Orsini has zero vacation. Mrs. Mutschler reported he requested in 2009 to take one week and roll over one week in 2010. Mayor Poling reported they are requesting vacation (five weeks) they would have earned if they worked. Mr. Googins suggested looking up the rules; feels they don't get it. Mayor Poling reported they were looking at when Dale Gatehouse retired he was granted vacation he did not get when he was off for a year. Mrs. Mutschler reported this was worked into a

retirement package. Mr. Fouse reported that was part of a retirement package; not sure Council is obligated to do that outside of an incentive for retirement which is what we categorized those deals. Mrs. Mutschler suggested it would be better if something came in writing. Mayor Poling reported it was in the request for the additional 15 days. Mrs. Mutschler reported when they read the letter it was based on the contract. Mr. Googins reported Council should review the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) Q & A (does an employee accrue vacation from the employer while on military leave of absence – answer was no); goes into some explanation; should look into this. Mayor Poling reported he wanted him to bring it to the meeting. Mr. Fouse reported what they are referring to is the Gatehouse circumstances; this was part of a retirement package; actually said in the resolution that it was not going to be used for any future effort to obtain extra vacation; was a special circumstance for a retiree. Mr. Rock reported Mr. Creese called him and he referred him to Mrs. Mutschler or Mayor Poling as it was Public Safety. Mr. Fouse reported the retirement resolution will be reviewed.

Mayor Poling reported he has a price on a replacement police car through the COG; will be a 2010 Ford Explorer, \$28,015; will get copies for everybody to look at; don't want to wait too long to replace the car; went into the following year and the price went up. Mr. Googins asked if the money from the Northern Lights Shopping Center Fund is ok to be used for that. Mayor Poling reported it actually is a car fund; there is \$41,000 in that fund. Mr. Rock reported the fund is for a police vehicle; (i.e.) can not buy something for this building or add on here. Mayor Poling asked if Council wanted to ok it tonight; or by the end of February in order to get the 2010. Mr. Thomas verified that the car is budgeted for. Mayor Poling reported it is from the Northern Lights Fund. Mr. Googins reported \$34,000 was put in the budget for a car. Mr. Rock reported the fund balance is \$41,000. Mrs. Mutschler asked if Mayor Poling was given the price for the change over. Mayor Poling reported no, just for the vehicle; it takes seven or eight months to get the car; there will be money left over in the fund to do the change over.

MOTION by Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski – to go with the specs the chief provided for Council to buy the new vehicle (2010 Ford Explorer - \$28,015). CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MANAGER'S REPORT:

1. Slappo Re-Zoning: Mr. Kunkle reported this issue will be on the next agenda.

2. Appointments: Mr. Rock reported he had contact with Mr. Sivy and we have done this in the past if a Council member asks and Mr. Sivy emailed him that he would like to be present at any appointments; would like appointments to be tabled until the next meeting; talked to Mr. Kunkle about this and this has been done as a courtesy in the past if a Council members asks; Mr. Sivy specifically asked that he would like to be here; has input on the appointments and would like to be here for them; would like to table the appointments until the February 9th meeting; fact is Council is still meeting on some of the committees/boards (EBMA).

3. Central Tax Agreement: Mr. Kunkle reported the agreement was distributed at the last meeting; attached to tonight's agenda; been discussed; originally Economy Borough has a three year agreement calling for renewal five year term; will be switching to a countywide collection in 2011 or 2012 at the latest; the attached agreement is for one year; Mr. Fouse has worked on this with their attorney and the recommendation is to approved this agreement and they will continue to collect EIT for 2010. Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski asked that the date be corrected on page one of the agreement.

MOTION by Mr. Googins, seconded by Mr. Bucuren – to accept the agreement between Central Tax Bureau and Economy Borough for the collection of Earned Income Taxes for 2010. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

COMMITTEE REPORTS and OTHER BUSINESS:

ORDINANCE and RECREATION:

Mr. Bucuren reported he turned in a fourth quarter checking account statement to Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski for the Finance Committee for the Recreation Board.

Mr. Bucuren reminded Council and the public that there are some upcoming events:

- January 29th – Seven Spring Ski Trip
- April 10th – Casino Seneca
- May 8th – 5K Race

Mr. Bucuren reported the meeting for the proposed firearms ordinance is scheduled for tomorrow at 7 PM.

Mr. Bucuren reported he had a call from a resident about Joe Luff working on Martin Luther King Day; they wanted to know why when the borough offices were closed why he was working. Mr. Kunkle reported he was going to be off the next two days to attend training he paid for; in that period he was working on six to nine additional Traditions of America housing units. Mr. Thomas asked if he got paid straight time for that day. Mr. Kunkle reported yes, because he was taking the next two days off without pay to get that work done. Mr. Thomas verified that he went to training, paid for it himself; did it has something to do with Economy Borough. Mr. Kunkle reported it had to do with accessibility which ultimately has to do with the borough. Mr. Thomas asked why he did not come forward and ask Economy Borough to pay for it. Mr. Kunkle reported he said he had read in the minutes where training was going to be curtailed so he went ahead and did it on his own. Mayor Poling verified with Mr. Kunkle the training was for handicapped accessibility. Mr. Thomas reported he suggested that back in November or December to maybe putting a halt to a lot of the training for this year for one year to cut the budget; only training that was a necessity is what he meant when he said that; that didn't seem to fly. Mr. Rock reported it did seem to fly; everyone was informed that it flew; that basically Council was not agreeing to any kind of training; Mrs. Mutschler has one coming up that is a very important one; thinks there will be no problem with; basically employees were told Council is cutting back; people did listen to Mr. Thomas.

PUBLIC UTILITIES:

Mayor Poling asked Mr. Thomas if there is anything with the new Verizon system coming in; for cable TV. Mr. Thomas reported he hasn't heard anything about it. Mrs. Mutschler reported she and Randy talked about it because it came up about Comcast when Larry talked about the cable boxes; if anybody has basic cable and you need the boxes, eventually you will loose your cable, you will loose channels and the TV will go black if you don't have some type of Comcast boxes for using a remote; reported it pays to call Comcast and to get a better rate; signed up for packaged bundles they offer; from basic cable (will have a box) and bill will be \$20 less per month from what she was paying before; you have to ask or they will not reduce the bill; hearing Verizon FiOS is on Big Sewickley Creek Road; does not know if you need 50 people in an area or petition from Economy Borough to move in here. Mayor Poling suggested Council could have Randy look into this. Mr. Googins reported through the COG and working with Comcast for the Franchise Agreement for several municipalities and talking to representative from Cohen and Associates, talked to them about the same thing; about FiOS coming in and the competition that would hopefully help; they work with them everyday; their opinion is that they are putting the lines in, but they are not going to turn the switch on for four or five years; not sure if that time is exactly right; are they going to put lines in and get this all set up before they ever start providing the service; that is what Cohen Group is expecting; maybe four or five years is on the far end; don't

know; they are looking at that too; it's their job, it's their livelihood so they want that also; they have no reason to say something pessimistic about it because they want it; that will help us all out because then we could get a franchise agreement with them also, if we want to do that; they are not expecting it to happen for a while; will be working with them on the franchise agreement for Comcast Cable. Mrs. Mutschler reported it pays to call and ask.

PROPERTY and BUILDING:

Mr. Kunkle reported one item Mr. Sivy asked him to bring up; the recently retired patrol car; had it checked compared to the car the CEO's are currently using and the recommendation from both Smitty's and Stanley's is that they keep the car they have been using; therefore the recently retired patrol car is excess and his recommendation is to put it out to bid. Mrs. Mutschler asked if a blue book value is needed. Mr. Thomas reported sealed bids has been done in the past.

MOTION by Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Googins – to put out for sealed bids, the 2003 Ford Crown Victoria retired police car, as is where is, to be opened at a determined date. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Discussion on the motion: Mr. Thomas asked if Council wants a starting price on the bid or not; nothing lower than \$1,000; does not know what it is worth. Mrs. Mutschler suggested looking to see what the blue book is; to give a ballpark. Mr. Bucuren asked which car it was; which one is Randy using and which one is Joe Luff using; asked if that car is worse than the cars being driven. Mr. Kunkle reported Stanley's worked on both cars and they recommended that they continue to use the one they have been using opposed to the recently retired patrol car; Mr. Sivy also wanted Smitty to take a look at both cars, which he did; he made the same recommendation, the car they have been using, they continue to use. Mr. Rock advised to get a blue book; get the mileage, fair condition. The motion was made and seconded, but the advertising will be delayed for a minimum price.

PUBLIC SAFETY:

Mrs. Mutschler reported Chief Harrington would like to send Sgt. Hartwell to training; takes place in Pittsburgh, April 19, 20 & 21; Homicide Training Class; provided course content; cost is \$250 for the three days; in the event they do not have a full class, it will be cancelled and will return the fee. Mr. Thomas asked if it is coming out of his budget. Mrs. Mutschler reported yes, he does have a training budget of \$5,000. Mr. Rock reported he talked with Mrs. Mutschler about this and she explained it. Mr. Thomas questioned if each different department (i.e. the police) has a training budget of \$5,000 and the police chief feels he would like to have someone go to this training, why does it have to come back to Council if it was already a budgeted item; if it wasn't budgeted could see coming back to Council to talk about and discuss; reason why he is bring this up is because there are other departments here that send people to training in the past and it has not come on this floor; wants to know why we are singling out one department. Mr. Rock reported he is under the impression any time Council sends any body to any thing it came through Council. Mr. Kunkle reported doesn't know if Council has anything written on that; knows if travel and expenses were involved, that is when it was generally expected to come to Council; if it was a morning or day in Pittsburgh or Cranberry or somewhere local, doesn't think it was brought here. Mr. Thomas reported his only point is if we are going to require the police department every time they want to send someone to training (a budgeted item) if it is out of the budget is one thing; he expects it to come to Council; why do we let other department decide; feels if one is brought up they all should be brought up; any one who goes outside of Economy Borough on any type of training whatsoever; the code enforcement officer, the borough manager, the borough secretary, anyone; if it is in the budget why are be bringing it up. Mr. Rock reported it should be brought to the borough manager that it is happening. Mr. Thomas reported he runs the day to day operations. Mr. Rock reported he is not up there with the police department. Mr. Thomas reported that is still a function of Economy Borough, still a department in Economy

Borough. Mr. Rock reported even though, Chief Harrington has a budget, can send them; should notify down here. Mr. Thomas reported he is not saying you don't notify the office, yes. Mr. Rock reported it does need to be voted on. Mayor Poling reported that is why you have department heads, the chief, road foreman, manager. Mr. Thomas reported sometimes Council does it one way and sometimes we do it another; lets do it one way or another. Mr. Googins asked Mr. Fouse if there was something in the state borough code about training has to be approved; talking about what the borough code requires Council to do; thinks what they are talking about is if you send someone away, hotel expenses, etc. is what it is referring to; doesn't recall if it talks about training. Mr. Rock asked Mr. Fouse to check it out for Council. Mr. Rock reported he agrees with Mr. Thomas, if he has it in his budget and has x number of dollars, why should he have to come to Council and explain to Council; should tell the borough manager where he is going; if it is budgeted, it is up to any supervisor to handle that particular budget in such a way so that in June they are not looking for more money; will let Mr. Fouse check it out to make sure it is in the code. Mrs. Mutschler reported if Mr. Fouse researches it and it is ok to do this, that's fine, but it is common courtesy to let people know if an employee will not be in the borough; doesn't want to hear from someone that they saw someone out of the borough. Mr. Rock reported the common courtesy would be to tell the borough manager who then can tell Council. Mr. Googins reported it may be only referring to overnight stays and things like that, so that we can keep an eye on those kinds of things; agrees if money is put in the budget does not think we need to come to Council with a \$250 training sessions; come in an just saying you are going, would be nice to know to that information; does not see why the chief has to do that either for something like that; if he going to send the entire team to attend a larger amount Council should know; take a peak at it, it won't take long to look at it; maybe it's a Council policy that could be set if it requires an overnight stay, going out of town, or something like that; feels there was something in the state code about training.

MOTION by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski – to send Sgt. Hartsell to the Homicide Training Class 2010 for \$250, April 19, 20 and 21, 2010, based on the Public Safety Committee recommendation. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Googins commented Sgt. Hartsell functions as the closest thing Economy Borough has to a detective; this is perfect for him. Mayor Poling reported Hartsell and O'Brien are the two best investigators. Mrs. Mutschler provided a copy of the training for the record.

Mrs. Mutschler requested an Executive Session in regards to the proposed police contract with a possible vote.

Mrs. Mutschler reported she did pass out information about the Beaver County Honor Roll talked about at the last meeting; getting the correct names of the officers for Council.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski reported she was asked what line item the \$400 contribution for the Beaver County Honor Roll plaque would come from; did inform the borough secretary to use line item 01.410.200 of Public Safety General Expense for the \$400.

ROAD DEPARTMENT:

Mr. Googins reported there were a couple of changes to the public works contract; requested Executive Session to discuss them; no vote, just present the contract. Mr. Fouse reported they sign first and Council signs second. Mr. Googins reported there is no vote, just a couple of changes before it is sent to the Teamsters.

Mr. Googins reported one of the trucks was recalibrated to use straight salt; was used on Conway Wallrose Road and Sunset Hills area; having the trucks recalibrated so that they can have better control of the amount of salt that is put down so we are trying to work in the direction to get rid of the black stuff; at least on the main

road. Mr. Googins reported they were out last week, as best they can, sweeping up the housing plan areas; they are trying to keep it as clean as they can. Mrs. Mutschler asked if the stuff was recyclable. Mr. Googins reported some of it is; they do pick it up; some of it has rocks and stones in it and can't be used, but in the housing plan areas is pretty clean and can be used over; they do recycle that. Mrs. Mutschler asked if they dump it over the hill. Mr. Googins reported you can't dump it over the hill; actually does not know what they do with it. Mayor Poling reported it's not good for anything; he tried to use it for a base; can't use it for nothing; it's garbage. Mr. Googins reported if it is clean they will use it. Mayor Poling reported it was nice to see the white stuff in the truck. Mr. Googins reported that is all except for the contract, with no vote.

REPORTS:

SECRETARY: No Report

ENGINEER: No Report

SOLICITOR:

Mr. Fouse reported on the litigation regarding the Ambridge Water Authority; they have delivered the studies to his office; finally has the information to go to trial; guessing between sixty to ninety days; more than likely will be in front of Judge Kwidis; he handles most of the civil matters.

MOTION by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mr. Googins – to enter into Executive Session to discuss the proposed public works contract, the proposed police contract, with a possible vote to be taken tonight.

Time: 8:37 PM CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOTION by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mrs. Sovich-Lapinski – to return to the regular order of business.

Time: 9:10 PM CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Fouse reported during the Executive Session discussed was both the police and road contracts and at this juncture we anticipate taking a vote on these contracts at the next meeting.

HEAR THE PUBLIC II:

No one wished to be heard.

Mr. Kunkle reported to Council that he provided copies of the franchise agreement for Comcast; it will be on the next agenda; read it; let him know if there are any questions to be addressed; will be on the next agenda.

MOTION by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mr. Googins – to adjourn the meeting. Time: 9:12 PM CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY
