conomy Borough Fire Department is proud to announce the arrival of our newest apparatus. It is a 2004 Pierce 100' aerial tower truck. The truck features a 1,000 gallon pump with a 300-gallon water tank. It also has a foam tank and pump. The aerial features a computer system which permits the operator to align the tower ladder in a safe manner. Fire Chief Jake Thomas explained, "our truck committee conducted a study to determine if an aerial truck was needed in this community. They looked at our present and future situations, and with the recent development in the borough, such as the new Walmart, plus their next expansion, the soon-to-be redevelopment at Northern Lights, this truck was a tool we needed to address many potential problems



we could encounter." Chief Thomas explained why a 2004 piece of equipment was purchased instead of a brand new one. He said, "the cost of a new tower truck would be 1.2 million dollars. Our committee did an extensive search and located this truck in West Palm Beach, Florida. We purchased it for \$375,000. The truck is in excellent condition. Our people have been working on it for the past month to adapt it to our specific needs."

There is a large savings by purchasing this truck compared to a brand new one. With the training required, the truck will be in service upon the publication of this article.

The fire department would like to thank our mayor and council for their continued support. Also to our residents who help us through the various fund raisers.

With the latest residential developments in the borough, we have strived to provide the equipment and training to handle all the calls we respond to throughout the year. Just last year, the department answered 240 calls for help.

Remember, we are here to serve and protect you, our residents.

BEWARE OF IRS SCAMMERS


Since October 2013 the federal government received reports from almost 900,000 people who were called by individuals falsely claiming to be IRS agents demanding immediate payments. Over 5000 people have paid over \$26.5 million as a result of the scam. The callers are aggressive and relentless, once they have your attention they will say anything to con you out of your cash. They will also demand payments be made by prepaid debit cards, money orders or wire transfers. If someone calls claiming to be from the IRS and uses threatening language if you do not pay immediately, that is a sign it is not the IRS and your cue to hang up. They will also threaten those who do not pay immediately with criminal violations, grand jury indictment, immediate arrest, deportation or loss of a business or driver's license. The con artist may know the last four digits of your social security number, make caller ID information make it look like it's the IRS calling, send bogus IRS e-mails to help support their scam or call a second or third time claiming to be the police. The IRS will never request personal or financial information by e-mail, text or social media.

A LETTER FROM E REID POWELL, LLC

Dear Valued Customer,

I am pleased to be Economy Borough's refuse collector and strive to meet all of your expectations when it comes to hauling your garbage. This letter should serve as a reminder of how my service works.

- 1. Your regular garbage pickup, for once a week service, is on ______ (depends on which street you live on, check with your neighbor or give me a call. This service entitles you to:
 - A. Two (2) thirty-two gallon cans, or four (4) bags, plus one (1) large item, such as a couch, stove, washer, etc. I can no longer accept refrigerators, or anything containing Freon, building materials, car parts, tires, televisions or computer monitors.
 - B. All garbage must be placed at the curb by 5:00 am the day of your scheduled pickup. (Most customers put their refuse out the night before.)
 - C. All regular garbage must be placed in a can or garbage bag.
 - D. Any refuse in EXCESS of your allotted amount will be picked up if placed in an orange E. Reid Powell trash bag. These bags can be purchased for \$9.00 per ten pack or 90 cents each at Doscher's Market on Big Sewickley Creek or at the Borough's Municipal Building.
- 2. Your cost for garbage and recycling service recently went from \$51.00 to \$57.00 per quarter (three months). This increase (\$2.00 per month) could have justifiably been much higher due to drastic increases in recycling costs but by working with Borough Council I was able to keep the increase more reasonable.
- 3. Twice monthly recycle pickup, the pickup days are dependent upon your garbage collection day, call me or the borough office for specific information. Recycle bins can be obtained at the Municipal Building at 2856 Conway Wallrose Road. Please place your bin, or similar container, at the curb by 5:00 am.
- 4. Items that are recyclable include:

PLASTIC

BOTTLES

GLASS

STEEL CANS

ALUMINUM

- 5. Recyclables can be co-mingled and all food containers should be rinsed with lids removed.
- 6. Cardboard recycling containers are located at the rear of the Borough Complex property, behind the baseball field, next to the pavilion. Please flatten all cardboard. Boy Scout Troop 414 collects newspapers on the second Saturday of each month from 9:00 am to noon in front of the Borough Garage. This is used as bedding for local farm animals.

Emissions Inspections: Vehicle owners residing in Allegheny, Beaver, Berks, Blair, Bucks, Cambria, Centre, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Delaware, Erie, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Luzerne, Lycoming, Mercer, Montgomery, Northampton, Philadelphia, Washington, Westmoreland and York counties (regardless of zip code) may be subject to the federally-mandated Emissions Inspection (I/M) Program, Gasoline powered vehicles (9,000 lbs. or less gross vehicle weight) that are model year 1975 or newer and are registered in an affected county are subject to an annual emissions inspection. If PennDOT registration records indicate your address is located in one of the affected counties, registration documents will designate your vehicle as being subject to the I/M program. This means the vehicle and subject vehicles are required to pass an emissions inspection based on the county of residence.

Fee for Local Use: The applicant's county of residence may impose a fee of \$5 for each vehicle registered to an address in that county. The \$5 fee is collected by PennDOT at the time a vehicle is registered. The funds will be used by the county for transportation purposes or be allocated by the county in accordance with Section 9010(c) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code. 


Learn Alternatives to Debris and Trash Burning

- If you live in a rural area, make a wildlife brush pile, making sure it is set away from your home and outbuildings. Birds, rabbits, mice, insects and other critters can make a home in a brush pile.

IF YOU BURN, USE A PROPER BURN BARREL

Metal screen with holes not larger than ½ inch.



3 evenly-spaced 3 inch vents, backed by metal screen or holes less than ½ inch.

Mount barrels 6-10 inches off the ground on metal legs or cement blocks.

- Keep a water source nearby (a hose or a bucket of water)
- · Have a rake or shovel handy
- Ensure fire is out by applying water and stir with a tool until cold



PUBLIC WORKS PLEASE KEEP THESE IN MIND

Work Zone Safety is a top priority. Expect the unexpected in work zones. Slow down, be alert to workers and equipment moving in or near the work zone areas.

Keep cool, construction zone areas are only a temporary inconvenience. Pay attention to signs, flaggers, other vehicles and workers in these areas.

The spring and summer are prime construction times, expect delays, and leave a bit earlier if needed, to get to your destination. Consider using alternative routes to arrive on time avoiding construction areas.

Weekly grass mowing season is upon us and it is important to keep grass clippings off of the roads and out of our road drainage systems. Mow in a direction that will not throw clippings onto the roads. Don't sweep or blow clippings onto the street.

All residents are reminded to keep trees and shrubs on your property pruned so that they do not obstruct traffic signs, drivers sight lines or the public right-of-way walkways. Trim tree limbs, branches and bushes before they become a hazard to pedestrians and traffic on the roads.

The wood chips that result from the brush chipping service offered by the Boro on the 1st Monday of the month are available to Economy Boro Residents at no charge. The wood chip pile is located behind the baseball field at the Boro Complex. Please keep that area neat and tidy when taking wood chips.

Before beginning any outdoor digging project, remember to call 811 three business days before you dig. The service is free to homeowners and it's the law whether you are rotortilling, planting a tree or doing large excavation.

Please drive carefully, especially when observing road crews out working and have a great Spring and Summer.

TIRE ROUND-UPS

Need to get rid of old tires and/or rims from your car or light truck? The Independence Conservancy offers spring and fall Community Tire Collections at several municipalities in Beaver County. Economy has been on an 18 month cycle, the last collection being in the Spring of 2015, the next will be this fall, check the borough's website in a few months to see what Saturday it will be on. For a nominal fee, comparable to a tire shop, you can properly dispose of worn-out tires or wheels. There is no limit to the number of tires anyone may bring to the collection. No proof of residency is required. Individuals and small businesses are welcome. Cash or checks are accepted as payment. Watch for the schedule in the Beaver County Times or at independenceconservancy.org. All proceeds work for clean water and green space in Beaver County.







HAZEL'S LITTLE FREE LIBRARY

As reported in previous editions of the Connection the Lobby in the Borough's Municipal Building is home to Hazel's Little Free Library. As stated in its name this is a "Free" library whereby anyone is welcome to take whatever books they want.

FROM THE OFFICE OF CODE ENFORCEMENT

Chapter 3 of the Property Maintenance Code requires all exterior property and premises to be kept in a clean, safe and sanitary condition; this includes sidewalks, driveways, accessory structures, vehicles and swimming pools. Failure to properly maintain your property is a violation of the code.

FLOODING AND HAZARD MITIGATION

If your property is subject to recurring flooding there is funding available to help prevent future flooding, or in the worst case purchase your home (at fair market value) and have it demolished with no re-building permitted. There is also funding available to mitigate other hazardous situations. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) offers the following types of Hazard Mitigation Assistance: the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP); Pre-Disaster Mitigation; and Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) grant programs. Contact the Borough office for more information.
