Leaves must be in paper "leaf and yard waste" bags made specifically for recycling, and have a sticker on each bag that can be purchased at the Borough Office for \$1.00 each. Bags can be purchased at home improvement stores or at the Borough Office for 50 cents each. A Yard Waste drop-off container is available near the ball field at the Municipal Park. Leaves, grass and garden waste can be dumped there (no plastic bags). This is by annual permit only (\$25) which includes curbside brush chipping by appointment, please call the borough office for more details.



GARBAGE COLLECTIONS OVER THE HOLIDAYS: Christmas falls on a Monday this holiday season; garbage pickup for that day will move to Tuesday. As of press time the garbage contract for 2017 has not been awarded. We will notify residents of future pickups, including Christmas trees.

FROM THE OFFICE OF CODE ENFORCEMENT

Chapter 58 of the Economy Borough Code requires that all houses and businesses be conspicuously numbered with a street address. For those buildings that cannot be seen from the road, the mailboxes are to be numbered. The Economy Volunteer Fire Department sells reflective numbers for \$20, please call 724-869-5435 for more information.

All too often the Code Enforcement Office responds to calls and/or complaints related to demolitions, new construction or remodeling, only to find the proper permits were not issued. To be an active member ranges from a person willing to train to assist at an actual fire, but it is more than that. We train to assist at accident scenes for people injured and

helping with trees and power lines down due to storm damage. You do not have to be the type to fight a fire. We have people who work the scene to keep track of personnel inside a structure, or help direct traffic as a fire police officer. Also we are pursuing citizens who want to help with clerical work and organize fund raising efforts. There are a lot of opportunities to participate in making your fire department the best it can possibly be.

WINTER IS COMING

The Economy Borough Road Department has the responsibility of clearing borough roads of snow and ice from winter storms. Snow season will be here soon and our job is to keep roads passable by plowing and salting.

When snow accumulates on the roads our crews are out, but all roads cannot be treated at once. Some roads may be treated, but others may not. Untreated roads may be slippery and treacherous. If possible, stay off the roads during this period.

During snowfalls when plows are used, the main objective is to open the road for traffic flow. Expect to have snow pushed back to the curb on later passes or possibly later days after a snow storm. This gives the road crews space to push away future snow and to provide drainage when the snow melts, so that water runs alongside of the road, and not in the lane where it may re-freeze at night when temperatures drop.

Here are suggestions to follow during the winter snow season.

1. Do not drive unless absolutely necessary. Wait to give crews a chance to treat roads.
2. Remove all vehicles from the street. Park in your driveway or yard, but not on the street.
3. Do not shovel, snow blow or plow snow from your driveway or walkway in the street. Pile snow in your own yard instead. Remind any hired snow removal service to not put snow into the road for any reason.

4. Keep fire hydrants clear of snow so that they are visible and accessible for emergencies.
5. When you notice a salt truck approaching from the opposite direction, slow down and move away from the center of the road to allow for the salt spreader spray.
6. When following a salt truck, keep a safe distance back. Expect trucks to make sudden stops or turns when in the operation of snow removal.
7. Do not park in the street or areas where plow trucks turn around during snow events.
8. With winter around the corner please stay safe on the roads. We work hard making sure the roads are clear, if you see a concern let us know, 724-869-4779 x4.

We have had several requests for signs to remind residents who walk dogs to always clean up after them. This should be common sense and common courtesy but if not Borough Ordinance 22.3 can be used to help enforce the practice.

Do not blow or rake leaves into drainage areas as they could clog drainage pipes or culverts downstream. Also do not blow or rake leaves onto any of our streets.

Prune any low hanging vegetation so snow plows can do their job and remember the weight of ice and snow will cause branches to droop and hang lower over the roads – trim them accordingly.



SPEED HUMPS ON HARMONY ROAD

Weather and time permitting there are, or will be, speed humps installed on Harmony Road. Speed humps are used as a method of "traffic calming" to reduce the amount of pass-through and speeding traffic on residential roads. The borough has a traffic calming policy, which sets forth a long and burdensome process, on purpose, to help ensure calming only goes where a large percentage of the people living on the road want it. In the case of Harmony Road the process took well over a year to complete, but all of the residents wanted it and were persistent in their pursuit. In other words, don't expect traffic calming on your road based on a phone call, it doesn't work that way.

TIRE COLLECTION

The Independence Conservancy provides tire collections in the spring and fall every year. In 2017 tires were collected in Findley, Ohioville, New Sewickley, Big Beaver, Southside, Brighton and Ambridge. Economy still holds the record of over 1300 tires collected at one time and typically hosts a collection every 18 months. The borough will host a collection next spring on a Saturday to be determined from 9am to noon, the date will be published in the Times. Costs are as follows:

- \$3 car or light truck up to 18" \$5 if on a rim
- \$20 skid steer tires only
- \$20 tractor trailer tires only 19.5 to 22"
- \$20 farm tractor tire up to 75lbs
- \$40 farm tractor tire 75 to 150 lbs
- \$75 farm tractor tires only over 150 lbs

The borough is in need of volunteers to fill vacancies and alternate member positions on the Zoning Hearing Board and the Recreation Board.

The Zoning Hearing Board is a quasi-judicial body that meets the third Monday of each month, as needed. They make determinations on decisions of the Zoning Officer. They also conduct hearings and make determination on resident's request for variances and special exceptions. They could have as few as one hearing a year or, like this year, decide on three variances and a special exception.

A small stipend is paid for the months with meetings/hearings. Please send a letter of interest and/or a resume if you are interested.

The Recreation Board is undergoing a transformation and looking for new members and new ideas. Over the years a host of different events and activities have been provided by this Board including but not limited to 5K's, ski trips, casino trips, breakfast with the Easter Bunny and Easter Egg hunts, breakfast with Santa, Community Day, volleyball camp, basketball camp and martial arts classes among other activities. So, whether you would like to see more of the same or something new like pickleball, let the borough office know you are interested.

The Borough Council is also responsible for appointments to the Planning Commission, Municipal Authority Board and Civil service Commission. There aren't currently any vacancies on these boards, but if you are interested in serving in the future as vacancies come available, you may want to attend their public meetings to get a feel for their responsibilities and duties.

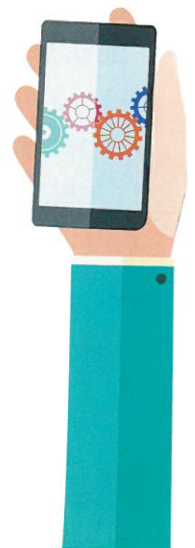
