PICKLEBALL IN ECONOMY BOROUGH



What is pickleball? You may have heard of it, and you may have even seen some of our residents playing it. Pickleball combines elements of tennis, table tennis, badminton, and racquetball. The game is very easy to learn and is popular with all ages, including teenagers and senior citizens. It can be played indoors and outdoors. In Economy Borough, pickleball is played in two outdoor locations. Our original pickleball court is located behind the Municipal Building Complex (Conway Wallrose Road) on the basketball court right next to the baseball field. Four additional courts, located at Jeffrey Meddock Park on Recreation Drive off Mary Reed Road, offers residents additional location for playing outdoor pickleball.

Pickleball is played on a court the size of a doubles badminton court. While paddles can be made of wood, most serious players prefer paddles made of

graphite or a composite material. The ball used is similar to a whiffle ball, with the size of the holes in the ball dependent on whether the game is being played indoors or outdoors.

FIRE DEPARTMENT UPGRADES

The fire department continues to make upgrades to our equipment to help serve you; our citizens. First, we now have in service a refurbished Four Guys International pumper/tanker. It carries 3,000 gallons of water and capable of pumping 1,500 gallons of water per minute. This apparatus has already proven its worth at several fires.

We also installed a unique piece of equipment in the chief's command vehicle called Enforcer 10. It is a 10-gallon portable firefighting system that compresses foam that can produce up to 200 gallons of finished foam. This unit has 75 feet of hose which makes it readily available to use. Chief Ted Brickner has used this device several times to either extinguish a fire or keep it under control until an engine arrived at the scene. What makes this Enforcer 10 handy is that the chief responds from his house.

Another new tool we will be using is called a QTAC 40's. It is a 20-gallon tank with a pump and hose to be placed on our ATV. It will be very helpful to fight brush fires. The ATV is mobile and accessible in rough terrain where our engines cannot traverse. Our department takes every opportunity to update and add equipment that will help benefit you; our residents. We hope you appreciate the time the volunteers put into not just answering calls but also practicing to keep up with various scenarios we encounter.

This last issue brings us up to the next topic: Pennsylvania Departments are in crisis. Jay Delaney, the president of Pennsylvania Fire Chiefs Association, testified last year to our state senate of numerous problems facing volunteer fire departments; many lack volunteers. In the 1970's there were 300,000 volunteers. Today, there are only 38,000. The president gave many reasons for this, but mainly the time required by the state to be certified as a fire fighter. The senate is searching for ways to entice new volunteers. Our fire chief, Ted Brickner feels we are able to respond with a full crew to our calls. According to the chief we are always looking for new volunteers. He stressed that our department has a good relationship with the mayor and council and that the Economy residents are very supportive of our needs. We strive to be able to handle any incident or emergency given to us.

We have great mutual aid with our neighboring departments and take pride in servicing our residents.

MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF TED BRICKNER

With fall and winter upon us, fire Chief Ted Brickner requests all homeowners to be especially careful with appliances. The most common cause of house fires (58%) is cooking incidents mainly started around the range or stove. The next cause is heating appliances but the most incidents (32%) revolves around portable heating devices such as electric heaters. Wood stoves also play a part in home fires. The vast majority of these relate to a chimney that was improperly cleaned or not cleaned at all.

Important reminder from Chief Brickner: It is best to burn seasoned and thoroughly dried firewood. When burning green or unseasoned firewood the result is a lot of smoke and messy residue and soot deposits in the stove and chimney. Every year our department respond to a half a dozen calls for chimney fires.



We are very capable and have the tools to extinguish a chimney fire. Do not hesitate to call 911 if this happens to you. Prolonging a call can cause a more serious problem. Your volunteers are here to serve you.

We wish everyone a happy and safe holiday.



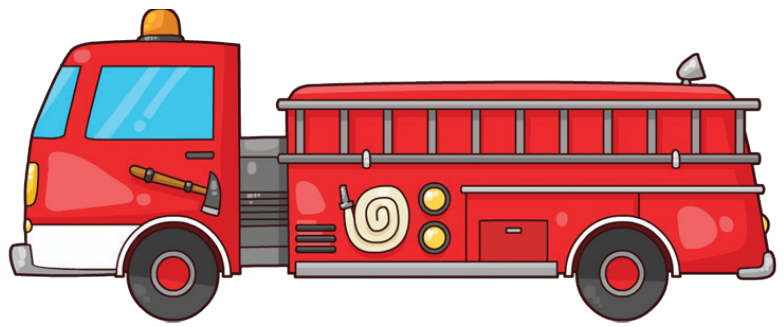

Curbside Leaf Collection

Curbside Leaf Collection will take place on the following Mondays: October 30th, November 6th, 13th, 20th, 28th and December 4th. Call the Borough office by the Friday before the Monday you want leaves collected. Leaves must be in **paper** "Leaf and Yard Waste" bags made specifically for recycling and have a sticker on each bag that can be purchased at the Borough Office for \$1 each. Bags can be purchased at home improvement stores.

Yard Waste Drop-off Container

A Yard Waste drop-off container is available near the ball field at the Municipal Park. Leaves, grass, and garden waste can be dumped there (no plastic bags). This is by permit only (\$50 per calendar year) which includes curbside brush chipping by appointment, please call the Borough Office for more details.



Garbage Pickup & Recycling/Christmas Tree Pickup

CPR FOR EVERYONE

On July 24 of this year, Economy Ambulance Service conducted a Family and Friends CPR class for the residents of Liberty Hills. There were over 50 participants that evening. For such a large group they were all very attentive, asked great questions and everyone took their turn with the hands on portion of the class. Besides CPR, they also participated in demonstrations of using an AED (Automated External Defibrillator). They are fortunate to have an AED on site at their Club House.



ECONOMY BOROUGH MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY

The Economy Borough Municipal Authority's Rules and Regulations regarding sewer use prohibits the discharge of harmful substances into the public Sanitary Sewer System. The Authority's Sanitary Sewer System is intended to handle primarily domestic or domestic-like wastewater.

Prohibited substances **MUST NOT** be discharged into the Sanitary Sewer System. The Authority reserves the right to require the pretreatment or exclusion of certain industrial/commercial/institutional wastewater and/or regulate the same through the issuance of a conditional discharge permit.

The following items **MUST NOT** be introduced into ANY sewer (public or private), either directly, or through a kitchen waste disposal unit:

- Glass
- Diapers or baby wipes
- Metal
- Socks, rags, or cloth
- Seafood shells
- Sanitary napkins, tampons and applicators
- Egg shells
- Baby wipes or personal care wipes
- Potato skins
- Plastic objects (toys, utensils, syringes etc.)

In addition, you must NEVER introduce into ANY sewer:

- Explosives
- Strong Chemicals
- Flammable material
- Straw/Mulch
- Gasoline
- Lubricating oil and/or grease
- Abrasives (sand, mud, kitty litter)
- Paint

Please keep in mind that any damages caused by any of the above listed materials will be at your expense.

ECONOMY AMBULANCE SERVICE SUBSCRIPTION TIME

As you look over your subscription this year, you may be curious why there is no longer a flat amount that may be owed by you in the event you use our service. What we have done is adopted a practice that our surrounding Ambulance services utilize, that being **"The patient responsibility will be cut in half for subscribers"**. This has become necessary over the last several years because so many people now have such high deductibles and high co-pays. We were writing off hundreds of dollars on each ambulance trip, which is no longer sustainable. You may be thinking, why I should even bother with a subscription now? Your subscription helps to assure that Economy Ambulance will have the staff, vehicles and equipment required to provide around-the-clock emergency protection for you and your family now and in the future. In addition, you will see on the brochure, all the other benefits.



BEAVER COUNTY REASSESSMENT

Beaver County is currently going through a reassessment and there are a lot of questions out there but, one stands out above all. What are my taxes going to be when this is completed? This is a valid concern, and the calculation below will help you calculate your ESTIMATED 2024 County, Economy, and AASD Tax Bill.

You will need to know your OLD and NEW Assessment Values.

First off, take your old, assessed value and divide it by 1,000 then multiply that number by 26 this will give you your County Tax amount for the 2023 Tax year. (Example old, assessed value 39,800)

$$39,800/1000 = 39.8 \times 26 = \$1,034.8$$

Now, take your new assessed value and divide it by 1,000 then multiply that number by 3.66. This will give you your ESTIMATED 2024 County Tax Bill. (Example new assessed value 182,400)

$$182,400/1,000 = 182.4 \times 3.66 = \$667.58$$

You can then calculate your estimated Economy Borough and Ambridge Area School Tax Bills by using the tentative millages below. *****THE 2024 TENTATIVE MILLAGE IS BASED OFF OF 2024 TENTATIVE TAXABLE VALUES THESE FIGURES WON'T BE FINAL UNTIL VALUES ARE CERTIFIED IN NOVEMBER 2023*****

Taxing District	2023 Millage	2024 Tentative Millage
County	26	3.66
Economy	16	2.0681
School	83.4709	11.793

The reassessment is a revenue neutral process meaning the initial rate (millage) will not allow the taxing district to collect more in real estate taxes across the taxing district.

Currently, estimated millage rates are tentative until the county certifies the tax rolls in November 2023.

New assessments will be applied in the 2024 tax year.

REAL ESTATE TAX INFORMATION

Annually, real estate owners are taxed by the county, the borough, and the school district, in that order.

Each tax has a 60-day discount period.

Beaver County: January - December 31, - Discount = 2%, Penalty 10%

Economy: March - March 31, of the following year, - Discount = 2%, Penalty 5%

School: July - December 31, - Discount = 2%, Penalty 10%

SNOW REMOVAL

The Economy Borough Road Department has the responsibility of clearing borough roads of snow and ice from winter storms. Snow season will be here soon and our job is to keep roads passable by plowing and salting roads.

When snow accumulates on the roads, our crews are out, but all roads cannot be treated at once. Some roads may be treated, others may not. Untreated roads may be slippery and treacherous. If possible, stay off of the roads during this period.

During snowfalls when plows are used, the main objective is to open the road for traffic flow. Expect to have snow pushed back to the curb on later passes or possibly later days after a snow storm. This gives the road crews space to push away future snow and to provide drainage when the snow melts, so that water runs alongside the road and not in the lane where it may refreeze at night when temperatures drop.

Here are suggestions to follow during the winter snow season:

- * Do not drive unless absolutely necessary. Wait to give crews a chance to treat the roads.
- * Remove all vehicles from the street. Park in your driveway or yard, not on the street.



- * Do not shovel, blow or plow snow from your driveway or walkway into the street. Pile snow in your yard instead. Remind any hired snow removal service of these requirements.
- * Keep hydrants clear of snow so that they are visible and accessible for emergencies.
- * When you notice a salt truck approaching from the opposite direction, slow down and move away from the center of the road to allow for the salt spreader spray.
- * When following a salt truck, keep a safe distance back. Expect trucks to make sudden stops or turns when in the operation of snow removal.

DID YOU KNOW?



The Borough has a “Community Room” that can be rented for private parties for \$50.* It is equipped with bathrooms, a small kitchen and the legal capacity is 50, although that would feel crowded. The Community Room is located in the Community Building between the Road Department and the Borough Office on Conway Wallrose Road. It is available free to nonprofit public groups that have open enrollment for residents. Contact the Borough Office to make a reservation or for more details.

MAILBOXES

Economy Borough repairs or replaces mailboxes and/or posts that are struck by the plow blade. A paint mark or tracks from a tire is evidence of a mailbox strike. Economy Borough does not repair or replace mailboxes and or post that fall from the force of the plowed snow. Mailboxes and supporting post must be installed to withstand the rigors of snow removal, including the force of snow pushed from the street onto the roadside.

If you have trees or shrubs growing out onto the street, trim them back as not to damage the trucks and mirrors on the trucks. If you have any questions, please give us a call.

All subsequent tenants must be registered within 30 days of occupancy.
