While cutting grass, please keep the clippings off the road. Six months of clippings can add up and adversely effect storm water systems adding additional nitrogen to the waterways.

REAL ESTATE TAX INFORMATION

BY AMY MILLER, TAX COLLECTOR

Taxes! Navigating them can be a source of frustration. Below is useful information on navigating real estate taxes. Annually, real estate owners are taxed from the county, the borough, and the school district, in that order. Each tax has a 60-day discount period.

BEAVER COUNTY:

January–December 31, Discount = 2%, Penalty 10%

ECONOMY BOROUGH:

March 1–March 31 of the following year,

Discount = 2%, Penalty 5%

AA SCHOOL DISTRICT:

July–December 31, Discount = 2%, Penalty 10%

A discount is offered for valid payment within the first two months of the billing period.

If you have not received an Economy tax bill, please contact the tax office promptly.

For any address or mortgage changes, please contact both the **Beaver County Assessment Office** and the Economy Borough Tax Office. It is the property owner's responsibility to notify the Beaver County Assessment Office of any changes that may affect your parcel or the collection of taxes.

Tax bills are **not forwarded**. If you winter in another state, please contact the tax office so your bill can be emailed to you at your winter address.

Please note that failure to receive an Economy Borough or Ambridge Area School District tax bill does **not** change the amount owed or the due dates.

To ensure timely processing of your payment, please remember to:

- Date your check
- Sign your check
- Enter the correct payment amount

Checks with missing or incorrect information will be returned. Including a phone number on your check allows us to contact you quickly if there is an issue.

Want to know what's going on in Economy Borough?



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THIS WINTER PRESENTED A LOT OF PROBLEMS



It was a very difficult winter for everyone. We have not witnessed this kind of weather in over a decade. There were numerous traffic accidents and structure fires in the county which pushed public safety personnel to their limits at times. Economy Borough was no exception. We experienced two major structure fires. One was a house fire that took place in the early morning. It was an old farm house and when our first engine arrived the structure was fully involved.

The second fire was a large commercial garage. It held contractor's equipment. This fire took place on the border with Baden and thanks to our mutual aid a heavy response was made and needed to battle this fire. One firefighter suffered an injury at this incident. He was treated and released from the hospital. Because of the extreme cold and

snowy conditions fire chief Ted Brickner had extra responsibilities to deal with. He takes command of the scene, but with the cold and ice from the amount of water needed to fight a fire safety was his number one concern. Ice forms on the street and hoses very quickly. These hoses can freeze up and hamper the effectiveness putting out the fire. We thank Economy's road crew for keeping the roads clear of snow and spreading salt at the scene.

In addition to these two fires we responded to ten other structure fires. Fortunately, their were minor incidents and quickly extinguished. During storms we handled 22 calls for trees and wire down. We respond to all vehicle accidents with injuries and this totaled 15 calls. Our department handled just under 200 incidents last year.

REPLACING AN OUTDATED STATION

Station #1 at the end of Conway Wal/rose road was built in 1968. After 58 years, the building has caused many problems. The bays were too small to fit the equipment including the engine, tanker and squad. Today's vehicles are much larger and carry more equipment to cover the incidents we respond to. Beside a leaky roof, this building was not meeting today's codes.

The new station should be in service soon. It features four bays with plenty of room for all of our equipment with extra storage space. The chief will have an office, a meeting room and social hall. Our committee kept the price to the minimum and only added the basic space needed for us to function properly.



NEW BRUSH TRUCK

Our building and truck committee needed to replace two old brush trucks. They came up with a unique way to do this while saving money. A few years ago, we received a grant to purchase an ATV. It is used for search and rescue but also to fight brush fires in hilly areas instead of buying a new brush truck which costs between \$150,000 and \$200,000 we set up our squad truck and converted it into a brush vehicle. It costs \$10,000 to set up properly to meet our needs.

We are constantly applying for grants to help upgrade our equipment. First Energy Company accepted our grant to purchase much needed hose on our engines. This amounted to \$14,000 and enabled us to purchase enough hose to be placed on all three engines.



BRUSH FIRE NOTICE

Due to the heavy snow and wind many residents will be cleaning their yards with leaves and tree debris. Be careful and only burn these items while obeying the borough's ordinances. Last year we responded to 10 brush fires.



MEET YOUR MEDICS

This Spring we would like to introduce to you Brandon Golden. Brandon has been an employee with Economy ambulance since 2022. Brandon came to Economy Ambulance as an Emergency Medical Technician but was already enrolled in Paramedic Class. He soon graduated and became one of their primary Paramedics after graduation. Brandon lives in the Wexford area but also calls Economy home now. Brandon currently is enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh in their Physician Assistant Program. Brandon enjoys helping people and also figuring things out. Brandon is not the first employee of Economy Ambulance to go on to bigger and better things. We have some who have gone into nursing, one that became a Nurse Anesthetist and even another Physician's Assistant. In the near future they have one employee set to enter Med School and become a



Doctor. Economy Ambulance is very proud of their present and past employees who have furthered their education and the continued desire to help people.

ECONOMY AMBULANCE IS HAVING GROWING PAINS



For several years now Economy Ambulance has been telling us about continued growth. They went from all volunteers, to an all paid service, and from 20 employees to now over 50. They went from having two ambulances to the current fleet of six. And this is where the problem begins.

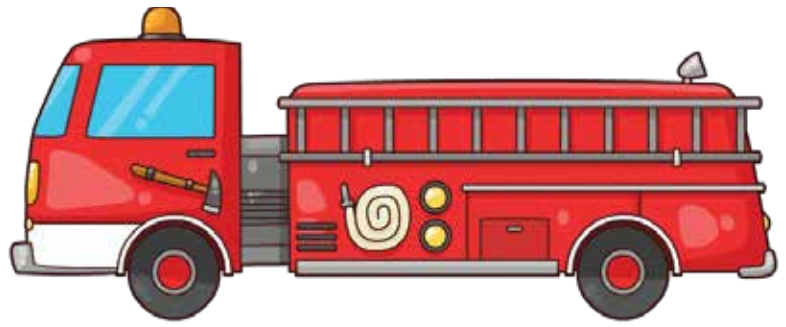
This past winter was a cold one. Their current station can only accommodate 3 units. Typically, at least two of the units are parked outside with electric heaters in them. However, with it being so cold for so long the heaters were struggling to keep up. Luckily for them, our local Fire Departments swooped in to save the day. Economy, Baden, and New Sewickley Fire Departments made garage space available during the coldest of days. While this was a great temporary solution, something needed to change.

Economy Ambulance is currently pursuing building a new station. If all goes as planned, the new station will still be located in Economy Borough. They are currently in the permit and design process and hopefully when this article goes to print will have broken ground.

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Pennsylvania Urban Nutrient Management —Spring Greening



As the snow slowly melts away, the birds begin to sing and fresh life bursts from the soil heralding the approach of Spring and the lawn maintenance season.

For the 1 million-plus acres of home lawns in Pennsylvania, selecting and implementing an appropriate lawn care management program to promote healthy and aesthetically pleasing lawns is not only important to homeowners, but is also essential to protecting our waterways.

KNOW WHAT'S BEST. SOIL TEST!

The first step to understanding what your lawn really needs to be lush, healthy, and green is to know what your soil needs. It is important to conduct regular soil tests to determine nutrient deficiencies that should guide fertilizer selection and application. Soil test kits can be purchased for a nominal fee from your local Penn State Extension office.

Following soil test recommendations, reading fertilizer label instructions, and using a properly calibrated spreader will ensure the right amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium are applied, while reducing nutrient loss and fertilizer cost.

SOIL HEALTH. IT'S THE BOTTOM LINE.

Maintaining a happy, healthy soil is imperative to your lawn's success. Soil is the foundation for your lawn and is home to a multitude of microorganisms that are essential for plant growth. Take the time to support your soil by incorporating some simple practices into your lawn care program. Your lawn and wallet will thank you.

- **Keep it open.** Routine soil aeration can help reduce soil compaction. Good soil structure is essential for proper root growth, healthy microbe communities, and the movement and exchange of water, air, and nutrients.
- **Raise it up.** Maintain a taller lawn by only cutting 1/3 of the grass blade with each mowing. Taller lawns slow runoff and promote deeper roots, which reduces lawn stress and improves soil structure.
- **Put it back.** Return nutrients and organic matter back to the soil by mulching your leaves and grass clippings.

For more soil management strategies, contact your local county conservation district or Penn State Extension office.

GREEN LAWNS - CLEAN STREAMS

Pennsylvania's 2022 Fertilizer Law amendments were developed to protect Pennsylvania waterways and the waterways downstream. As a bonus, following the limitations in the law will boost your bottom line by ensuring that your investment doesn't wash away. The 2022 law established the following nitrogen and phosphorus limits for turf fertilizer applications.

- Nitrogen is limited to 0.9 pounds of total nitrogen and 0.7 pounds of available nitrogen per 1000 ft² per application.
- No phosphorus can be applied unless establishing or repairing turf.
- Nitrogen and phosphorus rates can be adjusted based on soil test recommendations and/or if using an enhanced-efficiency fertilizer.

In addition to the nutrient limitations, the law also established application parameters to prevent direct movement of fertilizer nutrients into our streams:

- Do not apply fertilizer if a heavy rain event is expected.
- Keep fertilizer away from drainage ditches, storm drains, or water.
 - Maintain a 15-foot buffer from the banks of all waterways.
- Remove fertilizer that lands on impervious surfaces (driveways, sidewalks, roads, parking lots).

WORKING TOGETHER FOR CLEAN WATER

With ever growing acres of managed turf in Pennsylvania, controlling what goes into PA waterways is ALL of our responsibility. Help protect Pennsylvania's waterways by being wise when you fertilize!

- Needles (Sharps)
- Medication from businesses or clinics
- Lotions or liquids
- Aerosol cans
- Inhalers
- Thermometers

PREVENTING SANITARY SEWER BACKUPS

FLUSHABLE WIPES ARE NOT FLUSHABLE

So-called “flushable” wipes are anything but. They cling to everything. Which means they can cause clogs in your sewer lateral and/or the sanitary sewer system.

To avoid “flushable” wipe backups, the sanitary sewer system would have to provide a flow of at least four feet per second. Our system was designed for a self-cleansing flow or a minimum scouring velocity of two feet per second.

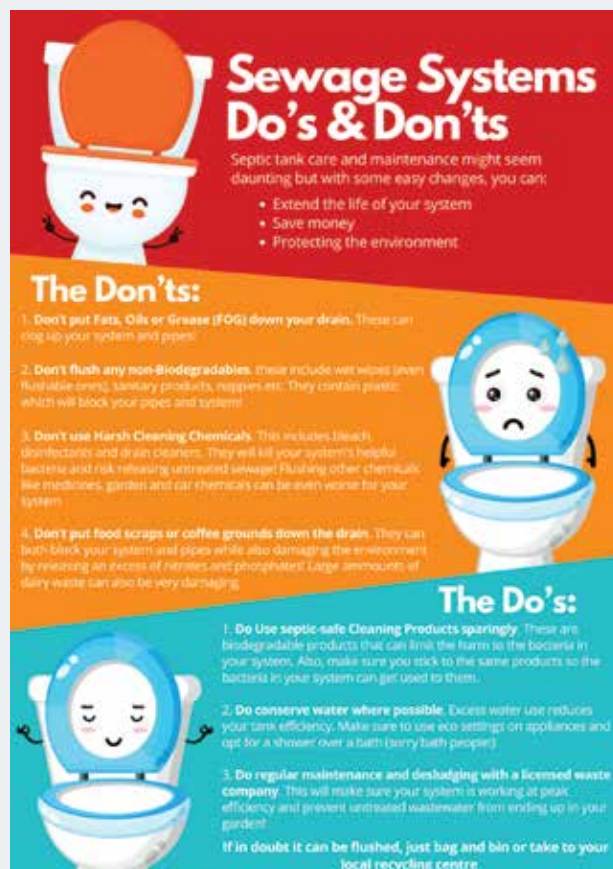
Therefore, “flushable” wipes are a huge problem.

If you use a grinder pump, you are way more likely to have an issue with clogs if you flush baby wipes or other personal hygiene products down the drain.

OTHER THINGS YOU SHOULD NEVER FLUSH DOWN YOUR TOILET OR POUR YOUR DRAIN

- Cat litter
- Grease or motor oil
- Tampons or sanitary napkins
- Egg shells or seafood shells
- Diapers
- Strong chemicals
- Condoms
- Dental floss
- Cotton balls or swabs
- Prescription pills
- Chewing gum
- Washing machine lint
- Tissues or paper towels
- Hair
- Plastic objects
- Potato peels

Under the PA Government Immunity Statute, EBMA has limited legal liability for sewer backups. The maintenance of internal plumbing and sewer service lateral lines is the responsibility of the property owner. If you have a backup, call a plumber immediately. If your plumber discovers the blockage is beyond the lateral, please call us immediately at (724) 869-3201.



LEASED AND RENTED PROPERTIES

All Properties that are Leased or Rented in Economy Borough must be registered with the Borough Code Enforcement Officer or Borough Secretary on a yearly basis.

It is the responsibility of all owners of leased/rented premises and of all persons who assist in the rental process to register with the Borough Code Enforcement Officer or Borough Secretary, the names and addresses of all persons who have leased, rented or otherwise arranged for the occupation of leased premises in the Borough. All subsequent tenants must be registered within 30 days of occupancy.

Chapter 111 of the Economy Borough Code (found at www.economyborough.org, ordinances, click on blue codebook, go to Chapter 111).



FROM THE ROAD DEPARTMENT

Road Department employees will soon begin to sweep the roads. We have one street sweeper and each road will require multiple passes making the project of street sweeping several weeks long. We will then be focused on mowing road berms and a few projects to improve drainage issues.

Residents are encouraged to help keep streets clean by picking up litter, mowing their yards so grass clippings and leaves do not blow onto the road surface.

Don't put anything into the drainage inlets as it will enter a waterway untreated. The borough appreciates you help in these matters.



REMINDERS FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

NO IMPACT HOME BASED BUSINESS: There are 10 requirements this type of business must meet to qualify. They can be found in the Borough's Code by going to www.economyborough.org; go to Ordinances, go to the last chapter #180 then to 180-78. The final requirement is to register annually in January with the Zoning Officer to verify the requirements are being maintained.

FOOD TRUCK VENDORS: A Mobile Food Vendors License is required to operate a Food Truck in the Borough, which are issued by the Code Enforcement Officer.

ACCESSORY USES (GARAGES, SHEDS, DECKS, POOLS, FENCES, ETC.): all require a permit from the Code Enforcement Officer.

DRIVEWAY PERMITS: are required for all new driveways to ensure they are safe and have proper sight distance. Drainage also must be accounted for. Existing driveways can be repaired or paved without a permit.
