HISTORY OF ECONOMY BOROUGH

From the time of its incorporation as a township in 1827 until it became a borough in 1958, Economy Township was governed by a three-man Board of Supervisors. The primary concern of the township was the building and maintenance of its roads. In the early days there wasn't any Police Department or Fire Department or vandalism or shoplifting problems; but there were often impassable roads, axle deep in mud or snow.

Supervisors' meetings were held in various places over the years. They were held at the Election House in Wallrose, in individual homes, and later at the Economy School, the Fire Hall, the Grange, rented space in the Northern Lights Shopping Center and finally the present Municipal Building erected in 1971.

In order to preserve the boundaries of the township and to prevent further annexation by surrounding communities, the necessary steps were taken in 1957 to become a borough. On January 1, 1958, Economy became officially known as Economy Borough with a Burgess-Council government.

Taxes in the past were quite different from what we have today. In 1929, the County "Poor" and personal tax on property valued at \$450 was \$4.28. The 1937 road tax for Economy Township on property valued at \$100 was just fifty cents. The 1940 school Per Capita Tax was \$5 - today it is \$10. Tax collectors from about 1910 to the present have been Michael McGuire, Leo McGuire, Howard Gross, Herman Ludwig, Walter Amsler, Fred Knoedler, Francis J. Kenney, Barbara K. Fitzpatrick, Maryann Nelson and Dorothy Gnarra, Nicole Thompson and Amy Miller.

In 1958 when Economy became a borough, Paul R. Merriman was elected Burgess and the following Councilmen were elected: William Livitski, Fred Bohn, Fred Engel, Dennis Poling, Arthur Cress, Albert Amsler and Frank Westerman. Felicia Polliard served as the first Borough Secretary until 1973 when she retired. Borough business was conducted in a small, cramped storeroom in the Northern Lights Shopping Center until 1971 when the Municipal Building was completed.

Economy Borough is a vital, caring, growth-oriented community with a population of 9,098 residents according to the 2020 US Census. The Borough consists of 19.42 square miles and was incorporated in January 1958. Because Economy Borough does not have its own post office, residents receive their mail through five different post offices in the area. Consequently, your address will either be an Ambridge, Baden, Conway, Freedom or Sewickley mailing address.

Economy Borough is part of the Ambridge Area School District. The School Board Meetings are held as follows: Meet and Discuss Meetings – the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m., and Regular Board Meetings - the third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. (unless otherwise changed by approval of Board).

The Borough is home to the Northern Lights Shopping Center on Rt. 65 (Ohio River Boulevard), Beaver County's Old Economy Park and Swimming Pool located on Rt. 989 (Ridge Road Extension), a small park on the grounds of the Municipal Building, one located in the Sunset Hills Plan of Homes and another, 'Jeffrey B. Meddock Recreation Park' on Recreation Drive for your recreational and shopping convenience.

The Economy Borough Community Building is available for meetings of Borough Non-Profit Organizations. The following is a list of some of the organizations presently using this facility: Brownies, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Bridger Baseball, Bridger Beavers 4H Club, Economy Jr. Women's Club and Economy Women's Club.

Recycle Cans

Some things just seem to go together and in Economy Borough <u>Boy Scout Troop 414</u> and recycling have become synonymous. If you are not recycling your cans at home, you're encouraged to help Troop 414 by bringing those items to the Road Department Garage. Boy Scout troop 414 and Economy Borough appreciate your support.

Plastic, glass and cans

Glass – Empty clear, amber and green glass from beverage bottles and food jars. **Metal Cans** – Empty aluminum, steel, bi-metal food and beverage cans, empty & dry foil trays.

Plastics (PET, HDPE) – Empty plastic bottles stamped #1-#7 on the bottom, milk and water jugs, liquid detergent, bleach and softener bottles.

Plastic tops and metal can lids must be removed and discarded. Food particles must be rinsed out to avoid odor and insect problems. Recyclables can be co-mingled and will be separated at the collection center. If you have not already received one, please see the Borough Secretary at the Economy Borough Municipal Building to receive a recycling bin.

Yard waste and tree trimmings – A \$50.00, Yard Waste Permit is required.

Economy Borough's residential yard waste collection program is available from April through November and consists of two parts: yard waste drop-off and tree trimmings pickup. Collection programs are for residential use only; commercial use is not allowed.

Yard waste can be deposited in the bin located behind the Economy Borough baseball field & basketball court. Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, & garden waste. Cardboard boxes and paper bags containing yard waste material is permitted, however garbage bags and plastic material is not permitted. Tree trimmings, shrubs, root balls, etc. are not allowed to be deposited here. The drop-off facility is open from sunrise to sunset.

Tree trimmings, small branches 8' x 4" or less and shrubs, etc. can be scheduled for curbside chipping & pickup. Yard waste material that cannot be chipped will not be picked up. For more information or to schedule a curbside pickup call 724-869-4779.

A single annual residential permit is required to participate in either program. A nominal fee is accessed to help defray the cost of transporting the material to the authorized dumping area. The permit can be obtained, and fee paid, at Economy Borough Municipal Office during normal business hours.
